

The "Pocket" revolver was produced from 1850 until 1873. Due to its small size and durable construction, it was a highly prized secondary weapon for soldiers of the Civil


1858 SWORD BAYONET

This is a sword scabbard bayonet manufactured from the peroid of 1865 to about 1878. These bayonets were popular with North and South during the American Civil War.



1840 HEAVY CALVARY SABER

The model 1840 Saber, often called the "wrist breaker", was a relatively heavy cavalry saber and saw extensive use by both sides during the Civil War. Due to extremely high demand for swords of this type, thousands of imported weapons were supplied to soldiers.



1816 MUSKET

The first "standardized" United States government produced military firearm after the Revolutionary War. The muskets were produced at the then new U.S. Government armories at Springfield, Massachusetts and Harper Ferry, Virginia from 1816-1844. When the Civil War started, Confederate troops siezed these muskets from state arsenals, and continued to use them until the end of the war.
