
IRA MASSIE

Massie enrolled at UK and
eventually became Extension
Tobacco Specialist there,
allowing him to make
connections with local
farmers. He soon found the
need for mass media
coverage on tobacco
farming. Massie started a
radio show, TV show, and
contributed to newspapers
and magazines. This lead to
him inheriting the nickname,
"Mr. Tobacco".
